REGIONAL OFFICE OF EDUCATION #11

Regional Office of Education #11 Superintendent Dr Kyle Thompson provided a detailed summary of the activities this office has or will or will be providing to the regional school districts. In June 2025 Annual report indicated that there were seventy-one buildings inspected serving the 19,995 students in our twenty-four public school districts. In addition to buildings, the 1589 teachers support and licensing is under the regional oversight were Issuing licenses, providing professional development, and disseminating information on vacancies. The regional office will function as a vital link between state education boards and local schools, offering support through professional development, legal guidance, and resource sharing, while also ensuring compliance by overseeing building safety, teacher licensure, and district organization.

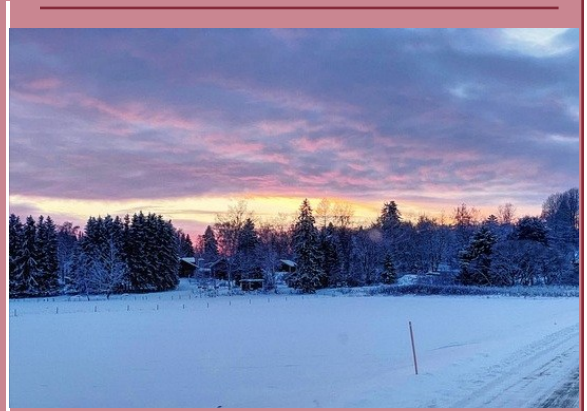
As the regional office is also responsible for maintaining the state requirement for 176 attendance days in a school year. The district addresses student needs, including those of homeless students, students with special needs, and truancy issues—by offering alternative education options such as GED programs and preventive education. Areas in this region need dual language instructors. AI and cell phone studies are currently two of the newest challenges facing our education system.

MATTOON WATER DEPARTMENT UPDATE

The Mattoon Water Department, a public community water system under the City Department of Utilities, provides water for about 19,000 residents living around Mattoon. Established in 1865, the Mattoon Water System is currently obtaining its supply from a blend of surface water sources: Paradise Lake and Lake Mattoon.

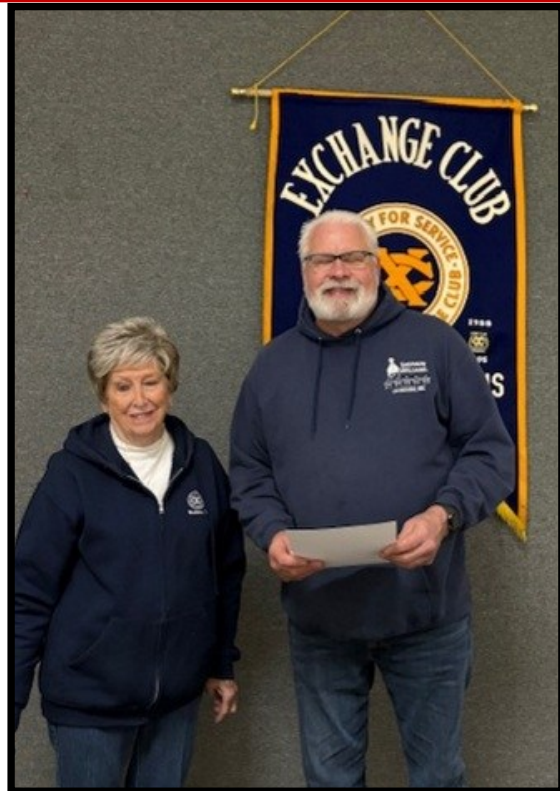
The Mattoon Water Department has received the **best-possible grade** because the amounts of contaminants found in the water supply were better than the Public Health Goal. Toxins from harmful algal blooms (HABs) are increasingly contaminating source water, as well as the drinking water treatment facilities that the source waters supply.

The City of Mattoon conducts testing at the Water Treatment Plant. While the City continually monitors the water quality, testing for specific harmful algal bloom (HAB) toxins, such as microcystin, can only be performed by the IEPA. The IEPA typically completes sampling and testing monthly of the raw lake water from Lake Paradise, Lake Mattoon, water treatment plant intake (raw) water, and treated tap water. The city has always followed the IEPA's recommendations regarding the frequency of testing.

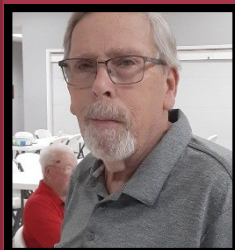

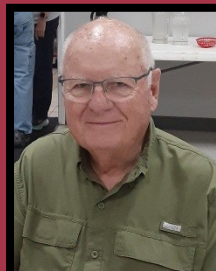

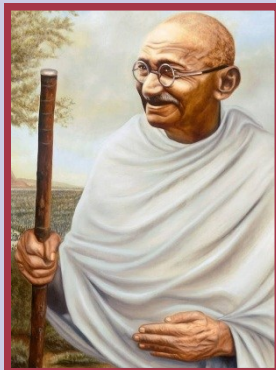
